
The COVID-19 situation in Germany

Total case burden

~ 226 cases per 100,000 (total cases: ~190,000)

> ~ 6,000 active cases

A flattened curve over time – but ongoing local outbreaks




Large testing capacities

~ 1,000,000

PCR tests per week

~ 9,000 total deaths

Germany's COVID-19 response phases



- Activating of contingency plans
- Intensifying disease surveillance
- Establishing a digital system monitoring ICU-beds capacity
- Setting up additional public hygiene campaigns
- Continuously communicating with international partners










- **Postponing elective surgeries**
- **Increasing ICU bed capacities**
- Increasing testing capacity and supply of PPE
- Providing surge staff to local public health authorities
- Implementing a partial lockdown
- Amending legislation where necessary
- Intensifying risk communication
- Supporting international solidarity








- Stepwise easing of restrictions
- Using a decentralised approach through federal state authorities
- Maintaining physical distancing
- Upholding specific hygiene measures
- Making the wearing of "community masks" in public transport and shops mandatory
