



COVID-19 Treatment Centers



7300 (4.3 beds per 1000)

COVID-19 ICU Capacity



373 (22 beds per 100,000)

Government Quarantine Capacity



2930 (1.7 beds per 1000)

All positive cases are admitted to treatment centers and are discharged after 10 days following rigorous retesting protocols

Option to allow self-isolation at home for asymptomatic patients, following strict guidelins

Contacts of positive cases could be optionally hosted in government quarantine facilities to monitor for any symptoms, or use of trackers at home


Cumulative Growth Rate
