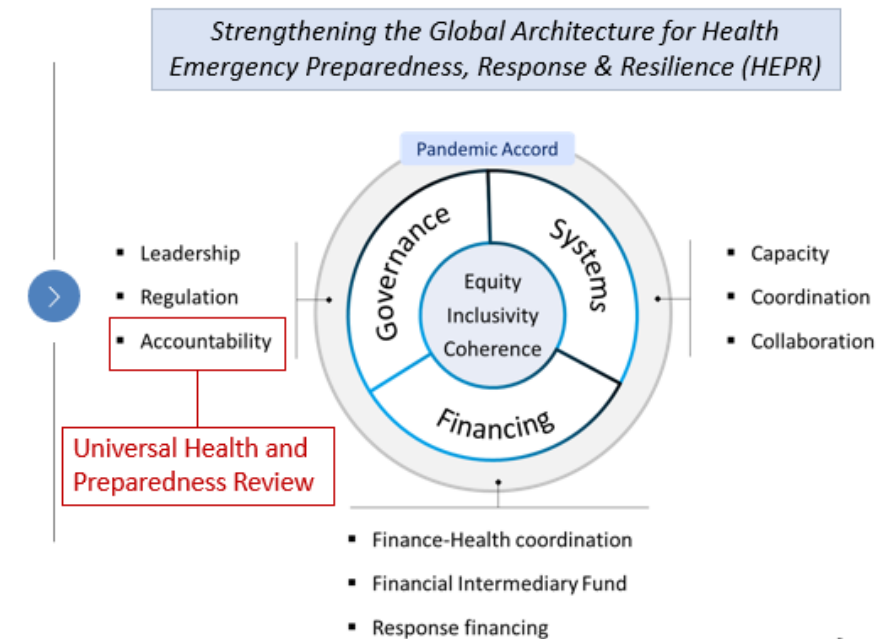

# Purpose of the UHPR

- Promote **global solidarity, peer-learning, pooling of best practices and jointly support capacity building**
- Track progress through a periodic review which will lead to greater **shared accountability and transparency** among Member States
- **Promote predictable and sustainable resources** by bringing a greater focus on where donors and partners can provide technical and financial support in line with critical gaps
- **Keep health emergency preparedness high on national, regional and global political agendas** to break the cycle of ‘panic and neglect’
- Enhance **multisectoral action** and **whole of society** approach

Multi-sectoral, Whole of Society National Report

STAGE 03

Global Peer Review (MS to MS) Expert Advisory Commission

STAGE 04

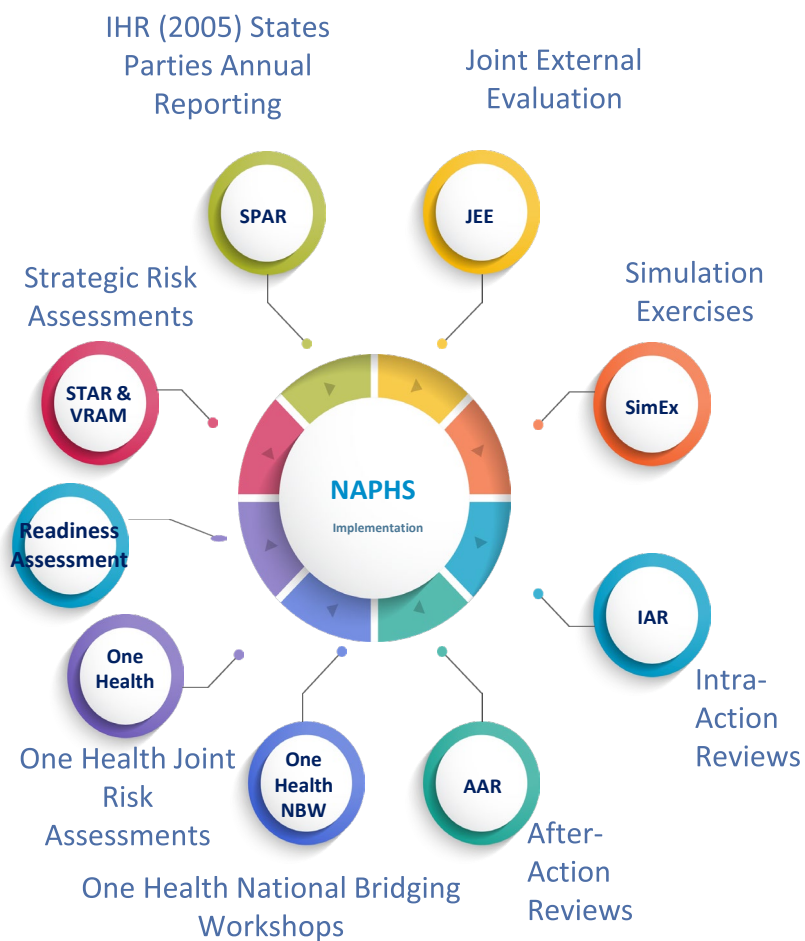

## The National Process

Preparing for the UHPR (12 Weeks)	High level engagement & support mission during pilot phase (3-4 days)	Finalizing the National Report (1 month)

## National Process: Relevant Reviews to consider



### JEE

- Expert-led evaluation
- Multisectoral self-assessment by technical experts at the national level that is reviewed by global technical experts
- Focuses on the engagement of technical experts up to the level of the Minister of Health
- Data collected using 19 technical areas
- Data does not currently look at health systems capacities and other interdependencies
- The evaluation uses a scoring system and includes technical recommendations in a public mission report developed jointly by national and global technical experts

### VS

### UHPR

- Member States-led peer review mechanism
- Multisectoral and whole of-society approach, involving all relevant stakeholders at national and local levels
- Focuses on highest-level political engagement as impetus for raising awareness, reinforcing multisectoral engagement, commitment and investments
- Uses data available submitted by countries. Information from JEE where available will feed into the UHPR process.
- Looks at key capacities not covered by any current (WHO) assessment tools i.e. governance, national systems and financing.

**UHPR not to replace existing assessment processes.**

## UHPR – a Country-led multisectoral mechanism to create enabling environment

### National Context:

Costed Multi-sectoral Investment plan.

Domestic and International Resource mapping

NAPHS

IHR MEF (JEE, SPAR, AAR, SimEx) & One Health

Threat and vulnerability, hazard specific and readiness assessments reports.

*Output: National report*

### Regional Context:

Regional intergovernmental cooperation, regional bodies, and regulatory frameworks

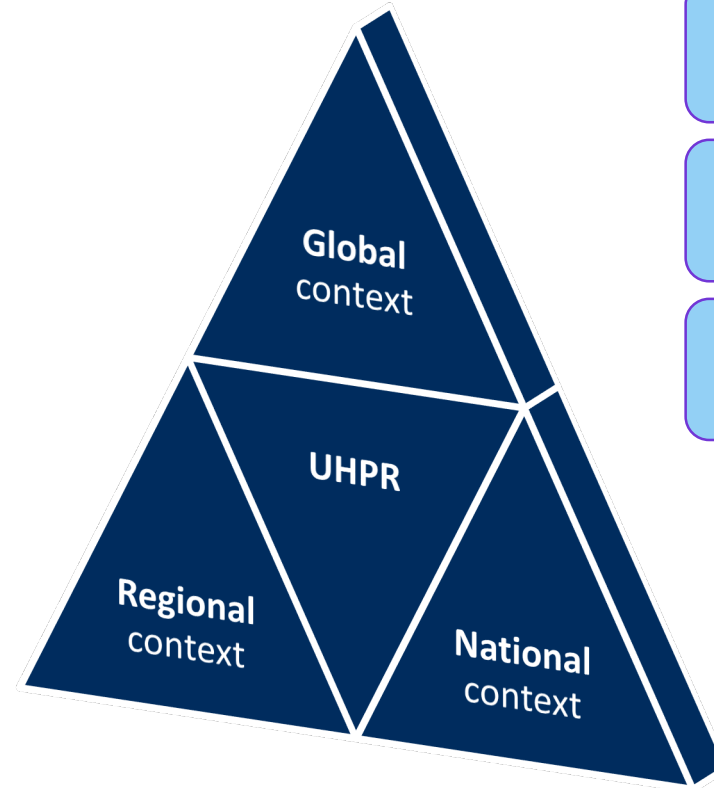
*Output: Expert Advisory Commission report*

### Global Context:

IHR WG (compliance committee) / WHO CA+ (peer review mechanism) / UN High-level meeting on PPR.

Domestic and International Financing, Solidarity and Cooperation

*Output: Global Peer Review Report – From MS to MS*

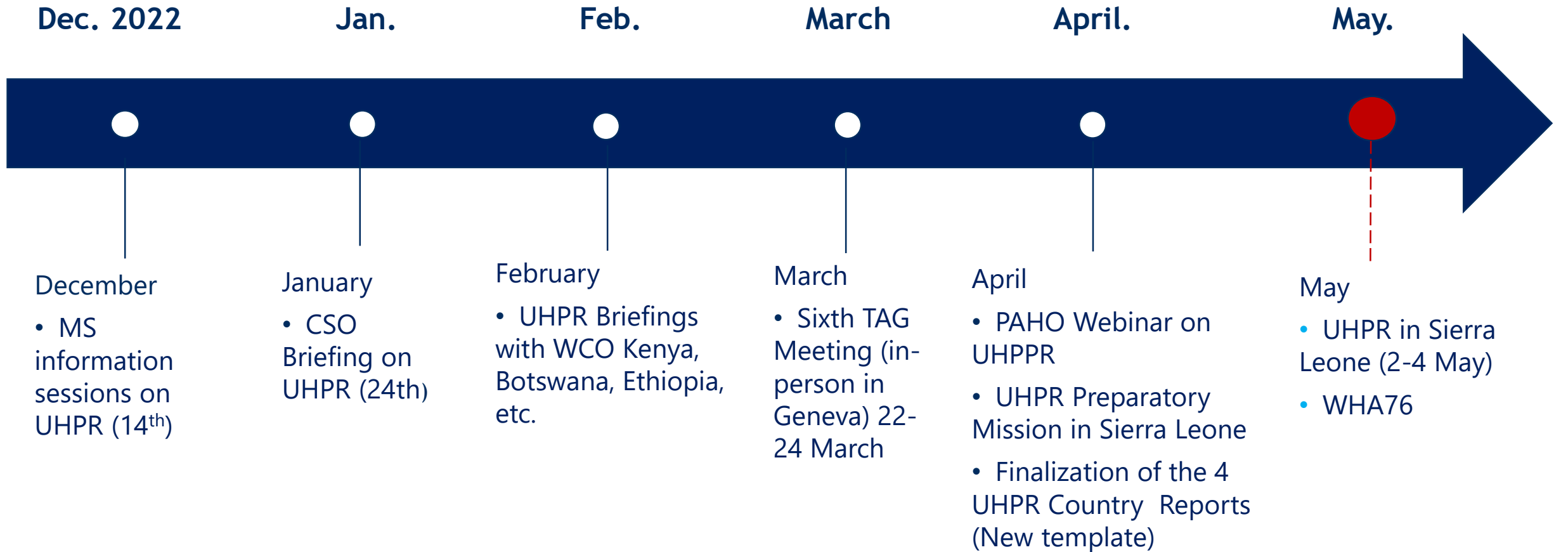

- Country pilots to continue in 2023:
  - Sierra Leone (2-4 May 2023)
  - Republic of Congo (Q2 2023)
  - Tanzania (Q3 2023)
  - Cameroon (Q3 2023)

- Results of pilots will be used to continually update UHPR tools and processes
- Pilot the Peer Review after WHA76
- UHPR side events during the coming regional Committees
- Follow up on UHPR discussions in IHRWG, INB, etc.
