If the Health Assembly adopts the draft resolutions and decisions referred to in the annexed table, the financial implications of adoption for the Organization are an increase of approximately 1% of the total approved budget for the approved Programme budget 2014–2015 and would require further funding to be raised as part of the Organization-wide coordinated resource mobilization plan.
