Despite the exclusion from the Development Goals of a goal on reproductive health, work continues towards achievement of the goals and targets set at the International Conference on Population and Development (ICPD) (Cairo, 1994) and reaffirmed in the key actions for the further implementation of the Programme of Action of the International Conference on Population and Development adopted by the twenty-first special session of the United Nations General Assembly (ICPD+5) (New York, 1999), in particular, the goal of providing access to reproductive health services.<sup>3</sup>
