

Human resources: annual report

Report by the Secretariat

1. The information below represents a preview of the Organization's staffing profile as at 30 September 2008. It includes details on the following: the overall staffing situation by main location and grade, and by appointment type; distribution of staff by sex; geographical representation; age and length of service of staff, and retirement projections and distribution of the workforce across the main occupational groups. As data from the Global Management System was not fully stable at end September, the data contained in this report should be considered as provisional. The tenth human resources annual report containing complete data on the staffing profile as at 31 December 2008 will be submitted to the Sixty-Second World Health Assembly.

STAFFING PROFILE

Appointment categories

2. At 30 September 2008, WHO had a total of 5395 staff members on either fixed-term appointments of one to five years or on continuing appointments (both referred to hereafter as "long-term appointments").¹ Of these, 2065 (38.3%) were in the professional category, 428 (7.9%) in the national professional officer category and 2902 (53.8%) in the general services category (see Table 1). The number of staff members holding long-term appointments has increased by 142 (2.7%) compared with the number reported in the annual report at 31 December 2007.²

3. In addition to staff holding long-term appointments, there were 1666 staff holding temporary appointments (see Table 2). Such staff represent 23.6% of the total staff, a figure that confirms the decreasing trend observed since 2004.

Distribution of men and women in the workforce

4. The percentage of women in the professional and higher categories has slightly increased since the last annual report as at 30 September 2007, rising to 37.9% from 37.1% (see Figure).

5. The distribution of staff with long-term appointments by organizational location, grade and sex is shown in Table 3. It can be seen that, of the 2065 staff members on long-term appointments in the professional category, 1283 (62.1%) are men and 782 (37.9%) are women. Women outnumber men at grade P.1, and as was observed in the last annual report as at 30 September 2007^1 at grades P.2 and P.3. The proportion of women at grade P.4 is now 41.2%, while at grade P.5 it is 31.4%. At P.6/D.1 level it has risen from 20.3% to 22.1%; and at D.2 level it is now 23.1%. The proportion of women in ungraded posts has risen from 26.1% to 27.3%.

Geographical representation

6. Of the 1888 staff serving in posts counted for geographical purposes, 799 were nationals of developing countries (42.3%). Of a total of 216 appointments up to 30 September 2008, 42.5% were from developing countries.

7. As of September 2008, 101 countries were within their desirable range (including six at the top of their range of representation); 41 countries (including two Associate Members) were unrepresented, eight were underrepresented and 45 were overrepresented (see Table 4). Table 5 gives details of the status of representation of countries, by region (the data excludes staff in posts funded by the country of their nationality). The following changes have taken place since the annual report as at 30 September 2007:

- five countries that were unrepresented (Comoros, Dominica, Suriname, Tajikistan and Marshall Islands) are now within their desirable range of representation;
- one country that was underrepresented (United States of America) is now within its range of representation;
- one country that was previously overrepresented (Myanmar) is now within its range of representation;
- three countries that were previously within their range of representation (Iceland, Lithuania and Swaziland) are now unrepresented;
- seven countries that were within their range of representation (Algeria, Burundi, Mali, Pakistan, Peru, Russian Federation and Sweden) are now overrepresented.

8. Table 6 provides information on the distribution of staff in the professional and higher categories by location of assignment and region of nationality.

Age, grade, length of service and turnover of staff

9. Half the staff in the professional category (50.6%) are under 50 years of age. In the general service category, staff in their forties represent the largest age group (33.1%), whereas in the national professional officer category, staff aged 50 years or more represent the largest age group (42.1%) (see Tables 7 and 8).

10. The largest single group of staff (representing 49.8% of the workforce) has less than five years of service. The approximate average length of service is more than seven years for professional staff, five years for national professional officers and eight years for general service staff (see Table 9).

11. Table 10 provides data on staff appointments (involving staff who have taken up duty in the period up to 30 September 2008). In the case of the professional category, it shows that 85 staff members (39.4%) were recruited externally, 110 appointments (50.9%) involved conversions of existing temporary contracts, and 21 staff members (9.7%) were reassigned through interagency transfer. In the professional category, 42.5% of all appointments were women.

12. According to current projections, 14.9% of the workforce is due to retire in the next five years and 33.7% in the next 10 years (see Table 11).

Occupational groups

13. Approximatively half the posts held by staff in the professional category are in the occupational group "Dental, nutrition, medical, nursing and veterinary specialists". Within this group, 90.3% are "Medical specialists" and 1.2% are "Nursing specialists", (this increase results from the appointment of three nurses). The second largest occupational group is that of "Administrative specialists", which accounts for 31.1%. In that group, 16.3% of posts are held by "Computer information systems specialists", 15.1% by "Administrative officers", 11.9% by "Financial management specialists" and 11.6% by "Public information specialists" (see Table 12).




Figure. Percentage of women in the professional and higher categories, 1990–30 September 2008
