ESTABLISHMENT OR DISESTABLISHMENT OF EXPERT ADVISORY PANELS

1. No change has occurred during 2018.

MEMBERSHIP OF THE EXPERT ADVISORY PANELS

2. Membership of the 43 expert advisory panels totalled 544 in November 2018, compared with 554 in November 2017. In terms of regional distribution, 11% come from the African Region, 24% from the Region of the Americas, 10% from South-East Asia Region, 29% from the European Region, 9% from the Eastern Mediterranean Region and 16% from the Western Pacific Region. Of the total of all members of all panels, 34% are women.
