Sixth plenary meeting

In the Chair: Dr Pagwesese David Parirenyatwa (Zimbabwe)
President of the Seventy-first World Health Assembly

The President informed the Health Assembly that formal credentials have been received from Armenia. In accordance with previous practice, the President has examined these credentials and found them to be in conformity with the Rules of Procedure of the Health Assembly. The President recommended that Armenia be accepted as having formal credentials. The Health Assembly approved the President's recommendation.

The Health Assembly accepted the list of 12 Members entitled to designate a person to serve on the Executive Board as drawn up by the General Committee in accordance with Rule 100 of the Rules of Procedure. The following were therefore declared elected:

Item 7 **Awards**

The President welcomed the distinguished recipients of the prizes and the representatives of the foundations. The Director-General was invited to address the Health Assembly.

- **Ihsan Dođramaci Family Health Foundation Prize**

The President announced that the 2018 Ihsan Dođramaci Family Health Foundation Prize has been awarded to Professor Vinod Kumar Paul of India.

Professor Ali Dođramaci, President of the Bilkent University, addressed the Assembly on behalf of the Ihsan Dođramaci Family Health Foundation.

Professor Vinod Kumar Paul received the award and addressed the Health Assembly.

- **Sasakawa Health Prize**

The President announced that the 2018 Sasakawa Health Prize has been awarded to Pro Palliative Care Unit Foundation of Costa Rica.

Mr Yohei Sasakawa, WHO Goodwill Ambassador for Leprosy Elimination and Chairman of the Nippon Foundation, addressed the Assembly on behalf of the Sasakawa Memorial Health Foundation.

Doctora Lisbeth Quesada Tristán, President of the Pro Palliative Care Unit Foundation of Costa Rica, received the award and addressed the Health Assembly.

- **United Arab Emirates Health Foundation Prize**

The President announced that the 2018 United Arab Emirates Health Foundation Prize has been awarded to The Korea Institute of Drug Safety and Risk Management (KIDS), of the Republic of Korea.

His Excellency, Ambassador Obaid Salem Saeed Al Zaabi, Permanent Representative of the United Arab Emirates to the United Nations Office, representing the United Arab Emirates Health Foundation, addressed the Assembly.

Dr Soo youn Chung, Director of The Korea Institute of Drug Safety and Risk Management (KIDS), received the award and addressed the Health Assembly.

The President announced that the 2018 His Highness Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah prize for Research in Health Care for the Elderly and in Health Promotion has been awarded to the El Badr Association, Cancer Patient Association, of Algeria.

His Excellency, Dr Basel Hamoud Al-Sabah, Minister for Health of Kuwait, addressed the Assembly on behalf of the State of Kuwait Health Promotion Foundation.

Dr Mustapha Moussaoui, President of the El Badr Association, Cancer Patient Association, received the award and addressed the Health Assembly.

- **Dr LEE Jong-wook Memorial Prize for Public Health**

The President announced that the 2018 Dr LEE Jong-wook Memorial Prize for Public Health has been awarded to Dr Nazni Wasi Ahmad of Malaysia.

Dr YoHan Ihn, President of the Korea Foundation for International Health Care (KOFIH), addressed the Assembly on behalf of the Dr LEE Jong-wook Memorial Fund.

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First report of Committee A

The President (Zimbabwe) read out the first draft report of Committee A, document (draft) A71/52 containing one resolution entitled:

The Chairman called upon the Rapporteur (Dr Alain Etoundi Mballa [Cameroon]) to read out the second draft report of Committee A, document (draft) A71/56 containing five resolutions entitled:

The Chairman reopened the subitem and invited the Committee to consider the report contained in document A71/19 Rev.1. The floor was opened for discussion and the Secretariat responded to issues raised. The Committee noted the report thus closing the subitem.

Item 12.4 (continued) – mHealth

The Chairman opened the subitem and drew the Committee’s attention to document A71/20 and invited them to consider the draft resolution *Digital health* as contained in document A71/A/CONF./1. Comments were invited from the floor and the Secretariat responded to issues raised. The Committee approved the draft resolution and the subitem was closed.

The programme of work was amended so that subitem 11.2, *Public health preparedness and response*, could be considered immediately following subitem 12.5, *Improving access to assistive technologies*. This was accepted by the Committee.

Individual statements in Committees A and B are limited to 2 minutes (220 words) and group statements to three minutes (330 words). Delegates are requested to deliver statements at a normal speaking pace. Rapid delivery risks impeding clarity and accuracy in interpretation. Statements provided in advance are treated as confidential and checked against delivery for the purpose of the official record.
