Thank you, Chair / Moderator,

India appreciates the Director General's initiatives to build capacity to introduce effective prevention of and response to sexual exploitation and abuse and harassment.

- 2. Taking note of the 'A UNIFIED FRAMEWORK FOR WORK ON PREVENTION OF AND RESPONSE TO SEXUAL EXPLOITATION AND ABUSE AND HARRASSMENT', India states that it concurs with the Report to have zero tolerance for, and for inaction against, sexual exploitation and abuse and harassment.
- 3. India takes note of the WHO's efforts to implement Management Response Plan, to provide adequate medical, psychological, legal, socioeconomic and reintegration needs of victims and survivors and to examine the needs of children born as a result of sexual exploitation and abuse.
- 4. India welcomes the initiative of the Secretariat of developing an agency-specific tool for risk assessment of sexual exploitation and abuse, which it will pilot in several priority countries in 2022. In this regard, we would like to understand the parameters on which these 'priority countries' have been identified.
- 5. Lastly, I would **reiterate India's commitment** to take concrete measures to learn from and align efforts on prevention of and response to sexual exploitation and abuse and sexual harassment.
