Thank you Chair!

India takes note of the report and supports the draft decision.

India recognizes the efforts of WHO in defining the approach in form of 5 pillars and 19 strategic goals as stated in 'Global road map for defeating meningitis by 2030' in order to achieve the three visionary outputs, namely

- (i) eliminate epidemics of bacterial meningitis.
- (ii) reduce cases of vaccine preventable bacterial meningitis by 50% and deaths by 70%.
- (iii) reduce disability and improve quality of life after meningitis of any cause.

India seeks clarity on how the strategic goals are going to work at a country level as the epidemiology of the disease varies across the globe.

Chair,

With reference to para 9 of the report India suggests participation of member states in developing comprehensive guidelines for the diagnosis, treatment and management of meningitis. This step shall contribute in making health services more people-centered and ensure quality health care service delivery.

WHO should also work with member states to ensure adequate vaccine stock for immunization against meningitis besides strengthening infrastructure..

India suggests the need to create a robust monitoring and evaluation mechanism and to share the progress with respect to each pillar and goal at country level. This would help policy makers and public health experts to take informed decisions and design targeted interventions.

Chair,

India would like to recommend that the global road map should be prioritized and integrated into country plans, to ensure enhanced advocacy and engagement.

Advocacy should be undertaken to ensure that there is **high awareness of meningitis**, its impact and to create a **commitment to equal access for meningitis prevention**, **treatment and support** for all those affected by meningitis.

The successful implementation of the road map will depend on regional and country engagement and political willingness to defeat meningitis.

These efforts will require aligned and effective partner support, including from the private sector and civil society, to bring together all globally available resources (technical, human and financial) as well as the support of the WHO. Thank You!
