Mozambique is aligned with the statement delivered by Ethiopia on behalf of the 47 African Countries.

We congratulate the secretariat for this didactyly detailed proposal for program budget 2024–2025. It provides a clear picture of the foreseen WHO program budget for 2024-2025, but most importantly will assist members states to better understand WHO program priorities, availably, allocations and fundings gaps at global, regional and country levels.

We praise that the program budget for 2024-2025, will increase country office allocation and members states involvement to build an enabling environment for better coordination, trustfulness and appropriateness. Thus, allowing that the final program budget allocation to reflect country priorities according to the country conditions and health needs but contributing to global targets such as primary health care strengthening toward universal health coverage. We commend the WHO efforts on increasing flexible funds allocation at country levels which will allow countries to better and efficiently respond to local health needs by allocating funds in the most meaningful interventions to improve people health.
