Voluntary Health Trust Fund for small island developing States (terms of reference)

Mr Chair,

Director General,

Excellences,

As a coastal nation composed also of several islands in the middle of the Atlantic,

Portugal's culture, economy, and identity are closely intertwined with the sea. The

country has a rich maritime heritage and a strong seafaring, exploration, and

fishing tradition. Portugal also recognizes the importance of sustainable ocean

management and is actively engaged in ocean research, conservation, and the blue

economy.

As a country with deep roots and historical connection with the ocean, we

empathise with the challenges Small Island Developing States (SIDS) face. Their

size, remote location, and vast distances pose unique obstacles. We experience

the challenges of supply chains in small islands or how difficult it is to maintain

capacity in the national health services in the islands. These difficulties are further

compounded by the impacts of climate change and the ongoing environmental

crisis. SIDS are particularly burdened by vulnerabilities that create stress and

jeopardize well-being.

All international support to address these challenges is welcome, particularly to

safeguard SIDS healthcare systems and advance the implementation of the SDGs.

Chair,

Portugal welcomes the Resolution previously adopted to establish a Voluntary

Health Fund for Small Island Developing States (SIDS) in WHO and commends

the adoption on this Health Assembly of its Terms of reference. As it occurs in

other UN fora, we recognize this as a fair measure to encourage wider

participation from interested states. As an example, Portugal is a regular donor in

the Human Rights Council for a similar fund that aims to promote SIDS

participation. This solidarity is the basis of an effective multilateral system.
