Honorable Chair,  
Excellencies,  
Ladies and Gentlemen,

We would like to thank and appreciate the Secretariat that has accommodated our input during the Executive Board Special Session in November 2017, by updating the draft of GPW 13 with the budget estimate over the five-year period, issues of healthy ageing, social determinants of health, immunization, and non-polio vaccine. We would like to kindly request that our input related to resource mobilization could also be accommodated.

We understand that in this GPW there are some changes in the draft document related to the priorities set and program strategy to be implemented in accordance with the SDGs, which calls upon member countries to immediately adapt to changes and challenges in global health.

We also understand that the Mission of the WHO is to ***“Promote health, Keep the world safe and Serve the vulnerable”*** and the priority strategy is to have triple billion targets that covers one billion more people with health coverage (Health Coverage), one billion more people made safer (Health Emergency), and one billion lives improved (Health Priorities). The target is very ambitious and needs hard efforts and continuous support from all stakeholders, including all office levels within the WHO, all members states, other United Nation Agencies, non-state actors, and the global community.

With regard to major shifts in the 13<sup>th</sup> GPW, we noted that the focus of the WHO, as stated in the draft document, is on how all member states should strive to achieve SDGs targets, especially in the domains of global health, Universal Health Coverage (UHC), Health Emergencies, and flagship determination to handle main health issues, such as climate change, Anti Microbial Resistance (AMR), Non-Communicable Diseases (NCDs). We are of the view that these issues require our undivided attention and should be solved as soon as possible.

To conclude, we extend our support to the drafted GPW 13 proposed by the WHO with some notes on resource mobilization for all top three priorities to be explained more clearly and transparently. We would like to know whether the programs and activities stated on the 12<sup>nd</sup> GPW but not included in the draft GPW 13 priorities would continue to be implemented, and seek the Secretariat’s kind assistance in facilitating the adjustment of Program Biennium 2018-2019 during the transition from the GPW 12 to GPW 13.
