

**STATEMENT BY THE DELEGATION OF THE REPUBLIC OF INDONESIA
ON AGENDA 18 WHO IMPLEMENTATION FRAMEWORK FOR BILLION 3
THE 150TH SESSION OF THE WHO EXECUTIVE BOARD**

Thank you chair,

We note the report provided under the agenda items

We note the WHO global plan for food safety and its focus for infection prevention and control in traditional food markets to reduce public health concerns linked with the sale of live wild mammalian species.

Indonesia recognizes the significance of taking suitable one-health measures to decrease the public health hazards connected with the sale of live animals in food markets, in accordance with the WHO worldwide policy on food safety.

Given the multifaceted character of zoonosis disease and risk factors surveillance, a single health strategy to this issue is very important.

It also considers that preventing pathogen spill over from animals to humans at the moment of encounter will be more effective in preventing and controlling illness in the human population.

Indonesia's commitment to this topic has been demonstrated by the release of a number of government regulations, guidelines, and programs on the subject, and we are committed to continue our work in this regard.

We welcome the work on urban preparedness as well as health promotions and well-being.

As a country with a number of highly urbanized and densely populated cities, Indonesia welcomes the Framework as a guidance for member states.

We look forward for the WHO to continue strengthening Member States' urban preparedness capacity.

We will support further discussion among member states on this two issues.
