## ACTION IN RESPECT OF INTERNATIONAL CONVENTIONS ON NARCOTIC DRUGS

The Seventh World Health Assembly, in resolution WHA7.6, decided that the Director-General, upon receipt of the appropriate expert advice, should take decisions as to the classification of substances under certain international agreements, and that he should inform the Executive Board of all such decisions.

The Director-General accordingly has the honour to inform the Board that, after having received advice from the Expert Committee on Addiction-Producing Drugs, he has forwarded to the Secretary-General of the United Nations, as required by Article 1 of the Protocol of 19 November 1948 bringing under

international control drugs outside the scope of the Convention of 13 July 1931 for Limiting the Manufacture and Regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, as amended by the Protocol signed at Lake Success on 11 December 1946, ten notifications concerning the following drugs:
