HIV AND RELATED LISTSERVS (E-MAIL NEWSLETTERS AND DISCUSSION FORA)

Listsers can be both a blessing and a curse – they enable you to stay up-to-date on many issues but can drown you in information that you really do not want. Striking a useful and manageable balance can be a challenge.

If you become a member of many listsers, you will receive a lot of e-mails that you may not want to read, which will clutter your e-mail inbox – so you may need to set up some “rules” or e-mail filters that automatically move the messages into folders named after the listsers. You can delete them later as needed without cluttering your inbox. It is easy to set this up. You can subscribe to many of the lists via web sites or by sending e-mails as indicated below.
