Description: An adaptation of the EPI logo, see above, to remind people that women should be immunized as well as their children.

D. COMPUTER SOFTWARE

COSAS 4.4 This programme analyses the results of EPI 30 cluster surveys for assessing immunization coverage. Coverage for children's vaccines and for women of childbearing age are analysed. The software is menu driven and allows analysis at three levels of complexity:

- ◆ first, a standard analysis developed jointly by WHO and UNICEF give basic information needed by a programme manager;
- ◆ second, a manual analysis that allows the user to select from a range of options including calculation of missed opportunities, age of immunization, season of immunization and many others;
- ◆ finally, the data in COSAS is compatible with EPI-INFO so that virtually unlimited analysis can be done by the specialist.

The output from the programme is compatible with most word processing packages and graphs can be generated automatically.

The software and the manual are available in English and French and a draft version of the software is available in Spanish. Free of charge in small quantities and \$10 per copy for larger orders.

(HLTHCOST) *A Lotus 123 spreadsheet for costing general Primary Health Care services or specific PHC interventions such as immunization or diarrhoeal case management. Capital and recurrent costs at 4 health centre levels are analysed to give a rapid review of major cost items. The user has the option of costing general PHC or allocating costs to specific health interventions. HLTHCOST provides information to programme managers so they can make more efficient use of the resources at their disposal.*

Available in English, French version to follow, free of charge

Computerized EPI Information System (CEIS) This software is used by WHO, UNICEF and other agencies to track progress of the EPI. Indicators used include immunization coverage, disease incidence, results of coverage surveys, programme activities and demographic data. When installed in a Ministry of Health office it is usually customized to respond to the needs of the national EPI as well as to the needs of the International Organizations.

Available in English only, free of charge.

*CEIS at EPI headquarters, Geneva, produces bi-annual reports on the global immunization situation. These appear as six Regional Summaries under the reference WHO/EPI/CEIS/ + current year and are available free of charge on request.
