# Human resources: annual report, 2001

## Report by the Secretariat

1. This third annual report on human resources provides data on human resources in WHO as at 31 December 2001 in order to ensure congruence with information submitted to the Health Assembly in the context of the Programme budget 2002-2003 and the financial report for 2000-2001. It contains data on the overall staffing situation by source of funds, main location and grade, geographical representation, age, sex, retirement age, external recruitment, national professional officers, and distribution of the workforce across the main occupational groups.

#### STAFFING PROFILE

#### **Appointment categories**

- 2. At 31 December 2001 WHO had a total of 3608 staff members on either fixed-term appointments of one to five years or career service appointments (referred to hereafter as "long-term appointments"). Of these, 1351 (37.4%) were in the professional category, 2085 (57.8%) in the general services, and 172 (4.8%) in the national professional officer category (see Table 1). The number of staff members holding long-term appointments has increased by 122 (3.5%) as compared to the 3486 reported in the annual report for 2000.<sup>2</sup>
- 3. Since 1994, there has been a moratorium on career service appointments, which are currently held by 56 staff members in the professional category as compared to 72 previously, and 216 staff members in the general service category as compared to 245 previously, or 4.1% and 10.4% of the respective categories. This represents a decrease of 22% and 12% respectively over the numbers reported in the annual report for 2000.
- 4. In addition to staff holding long-term appointments, 4746 staff were holding short-term contracts as at 31 December 2001 (see Table 11).
- 5. The tables and figure appearing in this document and following summary analyses relate to staff holding long-term appointments (unless otherwise specified).

#### Distribution of the staff by sex

- 6. The overall distribution by sex of the 3608 staff members on long-term appointments referred to in paragraph 2 above is 1903 men (52.7%) and 1705 women (47.3%). Of the 1351 professional staff members on long-term appointment, 921 (68.2%) are men and 430 (31.8%) are women. The percentage of women in the professional category has essentially remained unchanged since the annual report for 2000 (see figure).
- 7. In 2001, women represented close to 35% of the total at grade P.4, 24.5% of the total at P.5, and some 26% of the total at P.6/D.1. At the D.2 level, women represented 14.3% of the total compared to 9.8% in 2000. The proportion of women in ungraded posts has remained at 20%.

### Geographical representation

- 8. As of December 2001, 114 countries were within their desirable range (6 have reached the top of their range of representation), 21 were overrepresented, 14 were underrepresented, and 44 (including two Associate Members) were unrepresented (see Table 3).
- 9. During 2001, there were 171 appointments, of which 81, or 47.4%, were nationals of unrepresented or underrepresented countries. Six countries (Egypt, Ethiopia, India, Kenya, New Zealand and Senegal) that were previously within their desirable ranges have now exceeded the top of their range, whereas five countries that were formerly unrepresented (Andorra, Bhutan, Liberia, Romania and Solomon Islands) are now within their desirable range. One country that was within its desirable range is now unrepresented (Belize). One country, Ukraine, that was underrepresented, is now unrepresented. The remaining countries have maintained their previous representation status (see Tables 3 and 4).

#### Age, length of service and turnover of staff

- 10. More than half the professional workforce (50.8%) is aged 50 years or older. In the general service and national professional officers categories, 42.5% and 49.4% respectively are in their forties (see Table 6).
- 11. The largest single group of the staff (34%) has less than five years of service. This is true for national professional officers (87.8% or 151 staff out of 172) and professional staff (47.1% or 637 staff out of 1351). However, 51.5% of those who remain beyond the initial five-year period stay with the Organization for 10 years or more. The average length of service is 8.8 years for professional staff and 13.7 years for general service staff (see Table 8).
- 12. Table 9 provides data on staff appointments. In the professional category, it shows that 99 staff, or 57.9%, were recruited externally, 35, or 32.2%, represented conversion of existing short-term contracts, and 17, or 9.9%, were reassigned through interagency transfer.
- 13. Nearly 20% of the current professional workforce, some 6.4% of national professional officers, and over 11% of the general service staff are due to retire within the next five years (see Table 10).

#### **Occupational groups**

14. Over 46% of the posts held by professional staff are in the category "Dental, nutrition, medical, nursing and veterinary specialists". Within this group, 91.4% are medical specialists and 2.6% are

nurses. The second largest occupational group is that of "Administrative specialists", which accounts for 26.4% (see Table 12).


