Item 3 (continued) – General discussion

The Health Assembly resumed consideration of item 3 with special attention to the theme “Health-related Millennium Development Goals”. The President invited to the rostrum the delegates of the Russian Federation, the United Republic of Tanzania (who spoke on behalf of the countries of the Southern African Development Community (SADC)), Portugal, Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela, Turkey, Monaco, Viet Nam, Myanmar, the Republic of Korea, New Zealand, Belarus, Côte d’Ivoire, Chile, Luxembourg, Bhutan, Japan, Belgium, Slovenia, Uzbekistan, Equatorial Guinea, Kazakhstan, Uruguay, Cape Verde, Afghanistan, Argentina, the Philippines and the Czech Republic.

Second meeting of Committee A

– **Draft first report of Committee A**

The Chairman opened the meeting and invited the Rapporteur (Dr Praveen Mishra [Nepal]) to read out the first draft report of Committee A, document (Draft) A63/58, containing one resolution entitled:

– *Pandemic influenza preparedness: sharing of influenza viruses and access to vaccines and other benefits*

The resolution was approved and the draft first report of Committee A was adopted.

Item 11.3 – Public health, innovation and intellectual property: global strategy and plan of action

The Chairman drew the Committee’s attention to documents A63/6, A63/6 Add.1, A63/6 Add.2 and A63/A/Conf.Paper No.3 and gave the floor to the Chair of the Expert Working Group on Research and Development: Coordination and Financing.

The Chairman then opened this subitem for discussion and 28 delegations took the floor. The observer from Chinese Taipei and three nongovernmental organizations made statements.

The Secretariat and the Legal Counsel responded to issues raised after which 11 delegations took the floor.

The Chairman agreed with a proposal for an informal consultation, facilitated by Switzerland, in order to reach consensus on the way forward. The meeting was adjourned.

Item 11.4

Monitoring of the achievement of the health-related Millennium Development Goals

The Chairman invited the Committee to consider document A63/7, draft resolution EB126.R4, *Monitoring of the achievement of the health-related Millennium Development Goals*, contained in document EB126/2010/REC/1, and draft resolution *WHO HIV/AIDS Strategy for 2011-2015*, contained in document A63/A/Conf.Paper No.2.

The Chairman invited the Executive Board Representative to introduce this subitem.

Five delegates commented on the draft resolution EB126.R4 and one delegate requested amendments. The meeting was adjourned.

Invited speaker

The President welcomed Her Excellency, Ellen Johnson Sirleaf, President of the Republic of Liberia. President Johnson Sirleaf has led a distinguished international career and, in 2007, was awarded the prestigious Presidential Medal of Freedom, the highest civilian honour bestowed by an American president. In April 2010, President Johnson Sirleaf has graciously accepted to be the honorary President of the Women's Health Commission for the African Region. Mrs Sirleaf addressed the Health Assembly.

The President then welcomed Mr Ray Chambers, a philanthropist and humanitarian serving as the United Nations Secretary-General's first Special Envoy for Malaria. In this capacity, he is committed to achieving the Secretary-General's goal of ensuring universal access to malaria prevention tools in all endemic countries by the end of 2010, with the ultimate goal of achieving near zero preventable malaria deaths by 2015. Mr Ray Chambers addressed the Health Assembly.

Item 13

Health conditions in the occupied Palestinian territory, including east Jerusalem, and in the occupied Syrian Golan (*Item transferred from Committee B*)

The Chairman opened this item and invited the delegate of Egypt to introduce the draft resolution EB124/R4 contained in document A63/A/Conf.Paper No.6 *Health conditions in the occupied Palestinian territory, including east Jerusalem, and in the occupied Syrian Golan*.

Twenty-two delegations took the floor. In accordance with Rule 72 of the Rules of Procedure, a roll-call vote was taken. The vote resulted in 63 votes in favour to 8 votes against, with 51 abstentions and 63 Member States absent, as follows:

Twenty-eight delegations spoke after which the Chairman gave the floor to an observer from Chinese Taipei, a representative of UNFPA and ten nongovernmental organizations.

The Secretariat responded to issues raised. Five delegations took the floor and proposed amendments. The Chairman suggested that the agenda item remain open and be considered at a subsequent meeting of Committee A once a revised version of the resolutions, taking into account the proposed amendments, is available to Committee members.

Discussion of this subitem was suspended.
