Item 3 (continued) General discussion

The President resumed consideration of item 3 and invited the first two speakers to the rostrum: the delegate of the Plurinational State of Bolivia and the delegate of Latvia. These speakers were followed by the delegates of Mali, Côte d'Ivoire, Morocco, Spain, Sri Lanka, Brazil, (who spoke on behalf of the BRICS group), Slovenia, Bangladesh, Colombia, Portugal, Ecuador, Greece, Czechia, Kenya, Lithuania, Japan, Mexico, Paraguay, Tunisia, Luxembourg, Gabon, Algeria, Syrian Arab Republic, Costa Rica, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Norway, Senegal, Monaco, Finland, and the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela (who spoke onbehalf of the Non-aligned Movement (NAM)).

The Chair opened the meeting and welcomed WHO Director-General Dr Tedros. At the invitation of the Chair, Dr Ilunga Kalenga, Minister of Health of the Democratic Republic of the Congo, reported on the current Ebola virus disease outbreak in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. Dr Matshidiso Moeti, WHO Regional Director for the African Region, informed the Committee of the regional preparedness. The Director-General was invited to address the Committee and provide an update on the WHO response to the current Ebola virus disease outbreak.

Comments and questions were invited from the floor. The Minister of Health of the Democratic Republic of the Congo, followed by the Secretariat, responded to issues raised.
