Report of the Committee on Credentials

The President presented the report of the Committee on Credentials (document A72/68) which was approved by the Health Assembly.

At the invitation of the President, the Director-General Dr Tedros took the floor and presented the Minister of Health of Saudi Arabia, Dr T. Alrabiah, with WHO's special award in recognition of Saudi Arabia's successful programme to combat and increase awareness of tobacco use. Dr Alrabiah received the award and addressed the Health Assembly.

Item 3 (continued) General discussion

The President resumed consideration of item 3 and invited the first two speakers to the rostrum: the delegate of Kiribati and the delegate of Eswatini. These speakers were followed by the delegates of New Zealand, Sierra Leone, Georgia, Seychelles, Turkmenistan, Ghana, Rwanda, Comoros, Saint Kitts and Nevis, Djibouti, Bahrain, Equatorial Guinea, Lesotho, Cabo Verde (who spoke on behalf of the Community of Portuguese Language Countries/Lusophone Commonwealth (CPLP)), Jamaica, Saint Lucia, Ethiopia, Azerbaijan, Sao Tome and Principe, Lao People's Democratic Republic, Bulgaria, Solomon Islands, Panama, Bhutan, Barbados, Timor-Leste, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Cook Islands, Nauru, Belize, Benin, Madagascar, Haiti, Guinea-Bissau, Tuvalu, Burundi, Guinea, Niger, Gambia, Nicaragua, Burkina Faso, Central African Republic, Chad, Suriname, Albania, representatives of Palestine, the Holy See, the African Union, Inter-Parliamentary Union (IPU), the Order of Malta, and the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC). In accordance with Rule 57 of the Rules of Procedure, China exercised the right of reply.

The agenda item was closed and the meeting adjourned.

The Chair opened the agenda item with consideration of the first bullet point *Primary health care towards universal health coverage* and invited the Committee to consider the report contained in document A72/12 and the draft resolution EB144.R9 as contained in document EB144/2019/REC/1. The floor was opened for discussion.

The Secretariat responded to the issues raised. The Chair gave the floor to the Secretariat who read out the proposed amendments to resolution EB144.R9: *Primary health care*, which was approved, as amended.

• Community health workers delivering primary health care: opportunities and challenges

The Committee was asked to consider the report contained in document A72/13 and the draft resolution EB144.R4 *Community health workers delivering primary health care: opportunities and challenges* as contained in document EB144/2019/REC/1. Comments were invited from the floor.

The Chair announced that, due to time constraints, delegations who had requested to speak would be given the floor at the beginning of the next session, when discussion of this subitem would continue.

Under the third bullet point for this subitem, the Chair drew the Committee's attention to the report contained in document A72/14 and the draft resolution EB144.R10 as contained in document EB144/2019/REC/1. The floor was opened for discussion and, at the invitation of the Chair, the Secretariat responded to issues raised. The Committee approved the draft resolution, thus closing the agenda item.

Item 13 Opening of the Committee

In accordance with Rule 34 of the Rules of Procedure of the World Health Assembly, the Committee elected Dr Karen Gordon-Campbell (Guyana) and Mr Abdulla Ameen (Maldives) as Vice-Chairmen, and Dr Ahmad Jan Naeem (Afghanistan) as Rapporteur. One delegation took the floor to request that the European Union be invited to attend and participate without vote in the deliberations of the meetings, sub-committees, drafting groups or other subdivisions thereof, and addressing matters falling within the European Union competence in the Seventy-second World Health Assembly.

Health conditions in the occupied Palestinian territory, including East Jerusalem, and in the occupied Syrian Golan

The Chairman opened the item for discussion and invited the Committee to consider the draft decision contained in document A72/B/CONF./1 Health conditions in the occupied Palestinian territory, including east Jerusalem, and in the occupied Syrian Golan.

In accordance with Rule 72 of the Rules of Procedure, a roll-call vote was taken. The Chairman drew a letter in order to identify the first country to vote which was "Q". The vote resulted in 96 votes in favour to 11 votes against, with 21 abstentions and 56 Member States absent, as follows:

6. Arrangements for conduct of discussion in meetings

Individual statements in Committees A and B are limited to two minutes (220 words) and group statements to five minutes (550 words). Delegates are requested to deliver statements at a normal speaking pace. Rapid delivery risks impeding clarity and accuracy in interpretation. Statements provided in advance are treated as confidential and checked against delivery for the purpose of the official record.

Delegates wishing to have their statements posted on the Health Assembly website http://apps.who.int/gb/statements/WHA72/ may send it to statements@who.int and include in the subject line of the email the agenda item to which the statement relates. Additional information provided in this manner will not be included in the official record of the meeting.
