

## **Preliminary daily timetable for the Seventy-fifth World Health Assembly**

1. In 1979, the Thirty-second World Health Assembly, in resolution WHA32.36, decided that the Executive Board “shall fix a preliminary daily timetable for the Health Assembly’s consideration of its agenda and the General Committee shall review and approve this timetable, subsequently revising it if and when required”. At its 150th session (in January 2022), the Board considered a preliminary daily timetable for the Seventy-fifth World Health Assembly, which is submitted herewith (see Annex) to the General Committee. The timetable has been drawn up on the assumption that the Health Assembly will wish to limit the time allowed to each speaker (Rule 55 of the Rules of Procedure of the World Health Assembly) and bearing in mind resolution WHA50.18 (1997) which approved the request to delegates to limit to five minutes their statements in plenary. The timetable should be considered as indicative since the actual timing of items and subitems will depend on how the work of the Health Assembly proceeds.
2. The Board decided that the Seventy-fifth World Health Assembly should open on Sunday, 22 May 2022, and close no later than Saturday, 28 May 2022.<sup>1</sup>
