
Draft programme of work

- 1. Opening of the session and adoption of the programme of work**
 - The INB will be invited to agree to the programme of work as set out below
- 2. Definition of and agreement on the working methods and timelines of the Intergovernmental Negotiating Body to draft and negotiate a WHO convention, agreement or other international instrument on pandemic prevention, preparedness and response (INB), consistent with decision SSA2(5) (2021) and based on the principles of inclusiveness, transparency, efficiency, Member State leadership and consensus**
 - Determination of an inclusive Member State led process to be facilitated by the co-chairs and vice-chairs, to first identify the substantive elements of the instrument and to then begin the development of a working draft to be presented, on the basis of progress achieved, for consideration of the INB at its second meeting

The INB will be invited to:

- discuss a proposal from the INB Bureau regarding the process to identify the substantive elements of the instrument, in furtherance of the Bureau's mandate in this regard, as contained in document A/INB/1/5
- discuss and agree on the updated timeline and deliverables, based on the draft annex presented at the first meeting, as contained in document A/INB/1/6
- decide on the proposed modalities for the engagement of relevant stakeholders as contained in document A/INB/1/7, on the basis of the process established in the Working Group on Strengthening WHO Preparedness and Response to Health Emergencies, as set out in document A/WGPR/1/6

The Secretariat will provide a presentation on the modalities for public hearings, pursuant to operative paragraph 2(2) of decision SSA2(5), requesting the Director-General to hold public hearings, in line with standard WHO practice, prior to the second meeting of the INB to inform its deliberations
