Portugal supports the idea of developing a comprehensive new international instrument on pandemic preparedness. Such an instrument would be the expression of the global will to act together and ambitiously, giving us the opportunity to address key issues previously identified as shortfalls.

We call on all Member States to renew our common ambition to work towards a better prepared, more resilient, united, and fairer health world. Portugal is ready to fully participate in this effort.
