

MALARIA ERADICATION SPECIAL ACCOUNT

(Draft resolution proposed by the Delegation of Netherlands)

The Eleventh World Health Assembly,

Having considered resolution EB21.R41 of the Executive Board;

Sharing the concern of the Board that no guarantee exists that in coming years sufficient funds will be available in the Special Malaria Eradication Account for the execution of the programmes envisaged in this field;

Being convinced that without such a guarantee the Organization can not embark upon a world wide campaign of malaria eradication;

Considering that since the adoption of the resolution WHA10.32 the General Assembly of the United Nations by resolution 1219 (XII) decided to establish as an expansion of the existing technical assistance and development activities of the United Nations and the Specialized Agencies a separate special fund which would provide systematic and sustained assistance in fields essential to the integrated technical, economic and social development of the less developed countries, the target figure of this Fund being \$ 100 million for the year 1959,

1. REQUESTS the Director-General to explore by consultation of the competent bodies of the said Fund, how far governments of Member States can apply to this Fund for assistance in the execution of their malaria eradication programmes;
2. REQUESTS the Director-General to report on the results of his consultations to the Twelfth World Health Assembly; and

3. RECOMMENDS the Director-General to instruct the regional directors in the meantime to approach governments of Member States in the different regions to be informed what contributions they will make available to the Special Malaria Eradication Account during the years 1959-1962.
