RESOLUTIONS OF REGIONAL INTEREST ADOPTED BY THE
WORLD HEALTH ASSEMBLY AND THE EXECUTIVE BOARD

Resolutions of the Seventeenth World Health Assembly and of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth sessions of the Executive Board on the following subjects are attached:

1. Malaria Eradication

- (a) Malaria Eradication Special Account (EB33.R6 and WHA17.24)
- (b) Development of the Malaria Eradication Programme (EB33.R12 and WHA17.22)

The Regional Committee may wish to take note of these resolutions.

2. Accommodation for the Regional Office for South-East Asia (EB33.R26)

Here, the Executive Board has expressed the hope that the Government of India may find it possible to adhere to the principle contained in paragraph 2 of the preamble to this resolution, in any arrangements concluded as regards the occupancy of the excellent accommodation generously constructed for the Regional Office by the Government of India. The negotiations are proceeding.

3. General Programme of Work Covering a Specific Period (WHA17.38)

The Regional Committee may wish to take note of this resolution.

4. Community Water Supply Programme (WHA17.40)

The Regional Committee may wish to take note of this resolution.

5. Standard of Drugs (EB33.R28 Rev.1 and WHA17.41)

The Regional Committee may also wish to note the above resolutions.

6. Smallpox Eradication Programme (WHA17.43)

In this resolution, the Assembly has urged countries in which smallpox is still present, and which have not initiated eradication programmes, to plan and implement such programmes as soon as possible, following the recommendation of the Expert Committee on Smallpox; it has invited countries able to do so to contribute by making substantial voluntary contributions in cash or in kind, to enable the Organization to provide freeze-dried vaccine and other necessary materials and equipment to countries with sound eradication programmes requesting such assistance.

7. Co-ordination with the IAEA (WHA17.47)

Here the Regional Committee may wish to note the emphasis placed by the World Health Assembly in regard to the responsibilities of Health Departments in protecting the population from radiation hazards and in the medical uses of radiation and radioactive isotopes.
