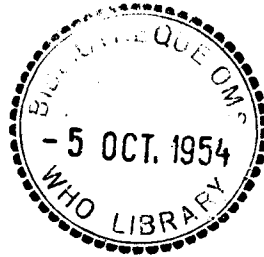

1. Name of organization

Fédération Internationale d'Education Physique. (FIEP)

2. Address of Headquarters

4. Membership(a) Total number of persons

The Federation strives to enrol Collective Members such as administrative organs, organizations, institutions etc. Furthermore the Federation has Individual Members, subscribers, and Honorary Contributing Members. Total number unknown (see (d) below).

(b) Do these persons pay directly or are the subscriptions paid by affiliated organizations?

The delegates collect the fees from the members and send them to the treasurer of the Federation. They are allowed to deduct 20% for their own expenses. The members can also pay directly to the treasurer.

(c) List affiliated organizations, giving their country, and the total number of persons belonging to each.

5. General purposes of the organization

The FIEP is an international organization with a world-embracing membership for the promotion of young people's health and welfare through suitable physical education planned scientifically. The aim of the federation is co-operation in questions of physical culture. It desires, with the aid of scientific research and experience in the teaching and practical technical fields, to achieve up-to-date forms of principles and exercises, useful to people in all countries. By the exchange of ideas, results of research and other practical experiences, the Federation endeavours to find the best possible solution to all those problems which exist in the field of physical education for men and women of all ages, not least in the education of school children, from physiological, hygienic and sociological points of view.

6. (a) What is the primary function of the organization?

1. The publication of multi-linguistic journals (FIEP-Bulletin and FIEP-Communiqué).
2. Arranging congresses: world congresses, normally, every fifth year and, between, continental, regional or national congresses, which include theoretical subjects and practical demonstrations with discussions. The third and last world congress was held in Istanbul in 1953.
3. Arranging international or national FIEP-courses of physical education in different languages for members from all the affiliated countries.

(b) Secondary functions

1. Arranging or participating in international and national gymnastics-, game-, or sport-festivals and of other educational or recreational physical exercises.
2. Promoting authorship in the subjects relevant to FIEP's activity and through translations bringing existing literature within the reach of the affiliated countries.
3. Distributing lectures, films and other demonstrations and arranging observation visits etc. between the affiliated countries.

(c) Further intentions

In addition the Federation intends to establish an international Information and Distribution Centre as soon as it is financially possible.

8. (a) Does the organization advocate any special health measures or procedures?

The Federation strives for the realization of the best possible physical education in all countries, while always taking into consideration the various geographical, economical and other circumstances.

(b) Has the organization any special reservations as to treatment or health procedures?

1. A sure foundation of physical education in school.
2. Continued (voluntary) exercises for children who have left school. This is considered to be very important.
3. Voluntary recreational exercises for adults of all ages.

9. Can officially designated representatives speak authoritatively for the membership on matters concerned with the stated purposes of the organization?

Between the General Meetings and the Council Meetings, the Executive Committee (members: President and Secretary-General) has the full right to speak authoritatively on all matters concerned with the purposes of the organization.

10. Specific interest with reference to the work of the World Health Organization.

The FIEP's programme endeavours to improve the people's health, especially through suitable physical training, scientifically planned.

11. Officers. (Names and positions held, including the Chief Executive Officer or Secretary and other principal administrative officials. What is the total number of paid officer personnel? Please distinguish between those with the international organization and those with the national or local groups attached thereto).

The International Organization:

Dr. Med. Hon. Major J.G. Thulin, President and senior editor responsible for the publications of the Federation.

Major O. Kragh, Secretary-General, Treasurer and editor of the publications of the Federation.

Mrs. Ann-Mari Ivarsson, secretary.

In addition, when publications are issued occasional assistance is sought for translations (and possible proof-reading) into English, French and Spanish.

Major Thulin and Major Kragh work without financial compensation. To other officers and for publishing etc. of journals approximately 10,000 to 15,000 Swedish Crowns are paid yearly.

The members of the Council, the sections and national representatives work without financial compensation.

12. Structure. (a) Policy making bodies such as Conference, Governing Body, Executive Committee, (b) frequency of meetings, with date of the last meeting of each, (c) voting procedure, (d) affiliation with other organizations, including international organizations.

Organization and administration. The organs of the federation are:

- A. General Meeting
- B. International Council
- C. Executive Committee (E.C.)
- D. National Representation Organs (FIEP-representations).

A. (a) The General Meeting consists of representatives for the affiliated countries.

(b) Ordinary General Meetings will be held in connexion with world-congresses; on other occasions according to the decision of the council. Invitations to General Meeting should be sent out at the latest five months, the agenda at the latest two months before the meeting.

B. (a) The International Council consists of: President, General Secretary (also responsible Treasurer), the three Section Presidents and max. six Members, with six Deputies, (representing to the greatest possible extent the various nations) who are elected by the General Meeting.

Note: At the election of President and General Secretary their places of residence should be taken into consideration so that they can together form an Executive Committee. (See below C.)

(b) The International Council, which is appointed for the period up until the next General Meeting, assembles in connexion with world-congresses and at other congresses if the E.C. or at least five members desire this. The

same is to be said concerning the assembling of the Council in other connexions. The Council has the right of decision when, after summoning all the members, at least six are present. When the President finds necessary, business may be submitted to the Members of the Council for written voting.

The Council elects within itself Vice Presidents, usually three in numbers. The Council has the right to elect Associated Members.

C. (a) The Executive Committee consists of the President of the Federation, the General Secretary and if possible of a third person (appointed by the President).

(b) The Executive Committee, which deals with all the business of the federation between the Council Meetings, assembles when the President finds necessary. The E.C. is responsible for the issuing of the publications of the federation.

D. (a) National Representation Organs consist of National FIEP-Committees and Delegates, when opportune also of Assistant Delegates.

(b) The National Committees (or corresponding organizations) arrange their representation according to their own decision within the bounds of FIEP's by-laws. The Delegate is a member (preferably, if not as president as secretary) of the national committee as a matter of course.

(c) The Delegate and the Assistant Delegate are appointed by the Executive Committee.

(d) In large countries - and also in other countries consisting of more states with their own department of education - where geographical, linguistic and economic circumstances motivate it, the country can be divided into several districts (states) with their own delegate. Otherwise assistant delegates can be appointed for various parts of the country (the work between delegates and assistant delegates is regulated by the former).

(e) Colonies and other overseas provinces and territories or corresponding possessions with their own department of education are to be considered as equivalent to a country (state).

13. Finances. (Annual budget and sources of income, noting portion received from membership dues)

The financial estimate is as follows:

14. History

The Federation was formed in 1923 in Brussels under the name of Fédération Internationale de Gymnastique Ling. This was principally a federation for Swedish drill. At first the Federation existed mainly "on paper" and the Secretary-General published the journal Bulletin one to three times a year. In connexion with the first Lingiad in 1939 the Federation held a General Meeting and decided to try to establish delegates in all affiliated countries. World War II, however, frustrated these plans. After the war, in 1946, the Council prepared to rebuild the organization. This was agreed at the General Meeting in 1949, where it was determined to emphasize and concentrate on physical education in schools. At the General Meeting (1953), the name was changed to Fédération Internationale d'Education Physique.

After the re-organization, the work was divided into three sections:

The School Section - Physical Education in schools and methods of teaching.

The Scientific Section - Scientific research with reference to physical exercises (in physiology, anatomy, hygiene, pedagogics, psychology and any other related field).

The Recreation Section - Voluntary gymnastics, sports and other recreational physical exercises.

15. Activities

(a) The Federation has published the journal Bulletin, "Education Physique et la Science" since 1931 with usually two or three editions a year.

(b) Arranged world congresses in 1939, 1949 and 1953 and regional 1947 and 1952. Three regional meetings are proposed for 1955.

(c) Arranged international courses in 1946, 1947, 1949 (Sweden), 1950 and 1953 (Belgium). Courses in South America between 1951 - 1953 took place in Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Chile, Peru and Uruguay.

16. Publications

The Federation is responsible for the publication of FIEP-Bulletin, "Education Physique et la Science". In this journal scientific articles in the original or in digest form are printed so that new scientific results of research and experiences are brought to the attention of the reader. The articles are written in a style that can be understood by the practical teacher. In the Bulletin, articles suitable for practical teaching are also published.

FIEP-Communiqué is a leaflet for members, containing information from all continents about those different types of physical education and recreational physical exercises which are within the FIEP's sphere of interest. Practical instructions are also published in the Communiqué, usually through a series of illustrations showing gymnastic-, game-, ball-playing- and athletic exercises.

The FIEP-Bulletin is published two or three times a year and the FIEP-Communiqué is issued monthly when the Bulletin is not printed.

The publications are printed in English, French and Spanish.
