ADMISSION OF NEW MEMBERS AND ASSOCIATE MEMBERS

Application made on behalf of Uganda by the United Kingdom
of Great Britain and Northern Ireland for Admission to
Associate Membership

The Director-General has the honour to inform the Health Assembly that on 5 April 1962 he received an application for Associate Membership in the World Health Organization made on behalf of Uganda by the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland. This application, dated 4 April 1962, has been made within the time limit provided in Rule 109 of the Rules of Procedure of the Health Assembly. The text of this application is set out below.

"Sir,

I am directed by the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to inform you that Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom, being responsible for the international relations of Uganda, wish to make application for the admission of that territory as an Associate Member of the World Health Organisation at the forthcoming World Health Assembly at Geneva in May 1962, in accordance with Article 8 of the Constitution of that Organisation.

In Uganda responsibility for matters of health rests with the Uganda Government. It is Her Majesty's Government's intention to authorise the Uganda Government to conduct the relations between the World Health Organisation and Uganda arising in respect of its Associate Membership if such membership is granted.

The Health services of the Uganda Government have reached a high standard of efficiency and Her Majesty's Government are satisfied that the application for Associate Membership may properly be put forward.

I am to add that Her Majesty's Government have no objection to a letter of convocation being sent directly to the Government of Uganda concerning the representatives they may wish to send to the forthcoming session of the World Health Assembly, should they so desire.
