1. TRANSMISSION TO THE HEALTH ASSEMBLY OF REPORTS OF THE MAIN COMMITTEES  
(Document A17/30)

Dr RENJIFO (Colombia), Chairman of the Committee on Programme and Budget, stated that his Committee had completed its work and, presenting to the General Committee his Committee's seventh and last report, congratulated the Chairman of the General Committee on the way in which he had directed the discussions.

The General Committee decided to transmit to the Health Assembly the seventh report of the Committee on Programme and Budget (document A17/30).

2. PROGRAMME OF WORK OF THE HEALTH ASSEMBLY

The General Committee decided to authorize the President of the Assembly if necessary to convene a plenary meeting either on Thursday evening or on Friday morning, in the event of the plenary Assembly's being unable to complete its work at the afternoon meeting, it being understood that the General Committee would have to meet again if it were necessary to change the closing date of the Assembly.

The CHAIRMAN thanked the Vice-Presidents of the Assembly and the Chairmen of the main committees for having carried out their difficult task within the required time, invariably displaying the greatest tact and complete objectivity. He also expressed his gratitude to the Director-General and all his fellow-workers for the valuable help they had given him.

Dr REFSHAUGE (Australia) congratulated the Chairman on the skill with which he had directed the discussions and thanked the Secretariat for having greatly facilitated the Committees' work.
