The Executive Board,

Having considered the Director-General's report on the findings and recommendations of the ad hoc Committee of Experts to Examine the Finances of the United Nations and the Specialized Agencies as submitted to the General Assembly of the United Nations and approved by that body on 4 November 1966 in resolution 2150 (XXI);¹

Mindful that under the terms of that resolution the Specialized Agencies are recommended "to give most attentive consideration to the recommendations contained in the report and to take appropriate measures within their respective areas of competence with a view to their earliest implementation";

Recalling resolution EB37.R43 which "requests the Director-General to co-operate in the studies to be made by the ad hoc Committee of Experts established to Examine the Finances of the United Nations and the Specialized Agencies, the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, and in any further inter-agency consultations" and "expresses the hope that all concerned in the studies will continue to give due recognition to the problems inherent in the individual requirements of each of the agencies concerned";

Considering that WHO was established to carry out specific technical functions in the field of health, that the preparation and presentation of its programme and budget estimates should continue to be developed to meet its particular requirements and that the Executive Board has been carrying out systematic examinations of the programme, structure, financing and administration of the Organization since its inception; and
