




New Delhi Declaration

on the impacts of climate change on human health



e, the Health Ministers of Member States of the WHO South-East Asia Region participating in the 26th Health Ministers Meeting in New Delhi, appreciate the efforts being made by countries and partners in the South-East Asia Region for addressing the challenges posed by global warming and climate change. However, we are concerned about the potential adverse impacts on health, which could be sudden, unpredictable and irreversible and thus overwhelm the response capacity of the health sector and jeopardize progress in achieving the Millennium Development Goals in general, and the health-related Millennium Development Goals, in particular. Chware of the fact that the most vulnerable populations in the SEA Region are the poor, the landless, the homeless, the very young, the elderly, the medically frail and people with disabilities, in particular those living on islands, in mountainous regions, in water-stressed areas, in urban slum areas, and in coastal areas;





We, the Health Ministers, commit ourselves to strive to: Implement the World Health Assembly (1) resolution WHA 61.19, on climate change and health and the regional framework for action to protect human health to develop and implement effective and efficient strategies and measures relating to climate change; Strengthen health systems capacity and notably (2) that of public health programmes that are already addressing health effects of climate change; (3) Increase awareness of health consequences of climate change within the health sector and in collaboration with other key sectors such as education, but also with nongovernmental organizations, in particular youth groups and consumer organizations and networks; Develop the capacity of health-sector professionals in addressing the challenges posed by global warming and climate change;
