INFORMATIONS ÉPIDÉMIOLOGIQUES — EPIDEMIOLOGICAL NOTES

GRIPPE

Les poussées épidémiques d'influenza signalées au cours des dernières semaines n'ont pris dans aucun pays une ampleur comparable à celle de la pandémie de 1957-58. Il s'est agi de grippe A₂ en URSS (où le maximum a été atteint à la fin de janvier) puis en Pologne, en Tchécoslovaquie, en Bulgarie, en Grèce, en Israël, dans l'Inde, au Japon. Au Royaume-Uni, des virus de types A et B ont été tenus pour responsables des poussées observées, ces derniers étant le plus fréquemment rencontrés. La grippe B, signalée sous forme sporadique en certains pays (République Fédérale Allemande, Tchécoslovaquie, etc.) au cours des derniers mois de 1958, a pris en janvier et surtout en février une forme épidémique en Italie, en Suède, au Danemark, aux Pays-Bas, en Allemagne du Nord, en Suisse, en Yougoslavie, en France. De divers côtés on signale des épidémies d'affections d'allure grippale dont la preuve sérologique n'a pu être faite, ou qui semblent devoir être attribuées à des adénovirus. Tel pourrait être le cas de diverses poussées épidémiques observées aux Etats-Unis, où cependant des souches B ont été incriminées en plusieurs régions.

La maladie s'est montrée partout bénigne ou modérément sévère et ne paraît pas avoir affecté sensiblement la mortalité générale.

Amerique

Des poussées d'influenza B ont été maintenant identifiées par l'isolement du virus ou par la sérologie en cinq régions des Etats-Unis. Il s'agit de la partie orientale du Massachusetts, le sud du Michigan, le nord de l'Indiana, le centre de l'Iowa et Washington, D.C. Aucune augmentation appréciable de la mortalité générale ou des décès attribués à la grippe et à la pneumonie ne s'est produite dans ces régions.

Europe

Allemagne (République Fédérale). Au cours de la première quinzaine de mars, l'épidémie d'affections respiratoires aiguës chez les enfants, qui avait entraîné de nombreuses fermetures de classes dans les régions de Hambourg, Lubeck, Brême et Celle a décliné considérablement. Ni le tableau clinique ni la sérologie ne permettent de l'attribuer à la grippe. La grippe B existe cependant, surtout dans la région de Brême. Dans cette ville elle a été responsable d'au moins deux décès très rapides. Dans la région de Hanovre, la grippe B se manifestait depuis juin 1958 sous forme de cas isolés. Leur nombre est devenu plus fréquent en automne. Au début de février la maladie a pris soudainement une forme épidémique; le nombre des cas décline depuis le début de mars. Tableau clinique typique; les enfants ont été particulièrement atteints (plus de 10.000 à Hanovre). On a enregistré sept décès presque subits, chez des enfants et des adultes, mais la preuve sérologique d'une grippe n'a pu être faite.

Pendant la semaine terminée le 21 février, le nombre des cas de « grippe » a continué à s'accroître en *Autriche* (8255 contre 2242 la semaine précédente).

On ne signale en *France* qu'une épidémie localisée de grippe en Haute-Garonne. Dans les régions de Lyon et de Grenoble, la sérologie confirme la rareté des infections à virus A₂ par rapport à celles dues au type B.

En *Pologne*, la grippe s'est manifestée sous la forme d'épidémies scolaires tout d'abord à Lodz vers le 10 février, puis à Varsovie et Gdansk (2^e décade du mois). Au début de mars l'épidémie affectait surtout les provinces du nord et du sud-ouest et les grands centres industriels: Varsovie, Lodz, Katowice. La maladie n'est pas très sévère. Cinq souches A₂ ont été isolées à Lodz et Varsovie.

En *Suisse*, la grippe décroît (3353 cas pour la semaine terminée le 7 mars, contre 6944 la semaine précédente).

INFLUENZA

The outbreaks of epidemic influenza reported during the last few weeks have not proved so severe, in any country, as those of the pandemic in 1957-58. Influenza A₂ occurred in USSR (where the peak of the epidemic was reached at the end of January), then in Poland, Czechoslovakia, Bulgaria, Greece, Israel, India and Japan. In the United Kingdom, both A and B types of virus have been held responsible for the observed outbreaks, the latter being the most frequently encountered. Influenza B, reported in sporadic form in certain countries (Federal Republic of Germany, Czechoslovakia, etc.) during the last few months of 1958, occurred in epidemic form during January, and particularly during February, in Italy, Sweden, Denmark, The Netherlands, North Germany, Switzerland, Yugoslavia and France. There have been reports, from various places, of influenza-like infections where no serological proof of influenza could be found; some may be attributed to adenoviruses. Such might be the case with regard to some epidemic outbreaks observed in the United States where, however, B strains have been held responsible in several regions.

Everywhere the illness has been mild or moderately severe and does not appear to have resulted in a marked rise in overall mortality.

America

Outbreaks of influenza B have now been identified by virus isolation or serologic tests in five areas of the *United States*. These are the eastern part of Massachusetts, southern Michigan, northern Indiana, central Iowa and Washington, D.C. There has been no significant increase in total deaths or in deaths from influenza and pneumonia in these regions.

Europe

Germany (Federal Republic). — During the first fortnight of March the epidemic of acute respiratory infectious in children, which had caused numerous classes to close down in the regions of Hamburg, Lübeck, Bremen and Celle, has decreased considerably. Neither the clinical picture nor the serology attribute these infections to influenza. However, influenza B does exist, particularly in the region of Bremen. In this town it has been responsible for at least two very rapid deaths. In the region of Hannover influenza B has been present in the form of isolated cases since June 1958. Their number became more frequent in the autumn. At the beginning of February it suddenly appeared in epidemic form. The number of cases has declined since the beginning of March. Typical clinical picture; children have been particularly affected (more than 10,000 in Hannover). Seven sudden deaths have been recorded, in children and adults, but serological proof of influenza has not been made.

During the week ending 21 February, the number of "influenza" cases has continued to increase in *Austria* (8255 as against 2242 in the preceding week).

In *France* only a localized influenza epidemic has been reported in Haute-Garonne. In the regions of Lyon and Grenoble, the serology confirms the rare occurrence of A₂ virus infections in comparison with those caused by type B.

In *Poland*, influenza appeared first in epidemic form in schools at Łódź about 10 February, then at Warsaw and Gdańsk (second ten-day period of the month). At the beginning of March all the provinces of the north and south-west and the large industrial centres were affected by the epidemic. The illness is not very severe. Five strains of A₂ have been isolated at Łódź and Warsaw.

In *Switzerland*, influenza is decreasing (3353 cases for the week ending 7 March, against 6944 for the preceding week).
