








### RICHER COUNTRIES SPEND MORE ON HEALTH...




### ...BUT NOT NECESSARILY AS A SHARE OF GDP



### MORE GOVERNMENT SPENDING ON HEALTH IS ASSOCIATED WITH LOWER OUT-OF-POCKET SPENDING




### DOES GOVERNMENT SPEND ENOUGH ON HEALTH?




### PRIORITY OF HEALTH IN BUDGET ALLOCATION IS A POLITICAL CHOICE




### IS RELIANCE ON OUT-OF-POCKET SPENDING DECREASING OVER TIME?
